



DKG US FORUM NLS March 6-8,2022

U.S. FORUM REPORT

The last zoom presentation of the US Forum Steering Committee was with Dr Ralph Propper who gave us a great talk on climate change and possible solutions to the problem. The Steering Committee met in Washington, DC early in December to work on the National Legislative Seminar resulting in the online registration for the upcoming National Legislative Seminar being opened. Please consider joining our team for a great training and up to date information on legislative issues of concern to DKG members.

There are also two optional tours: Monuments by Moonlight on March 5 and a Bus Tour on March 6 before the keynote speaker. Hotel information is linked to the NLS page. If you've never been to DC, this is a great opportunity at a low cost.

You can register either by using the QR code to link to the registration form on the ad posted on the state website or clicking on the DKG website rotator ad for the NLS that brings you to the dkgusforum.com website or the NLS link on the https://dkgusforum.com website. Last day to register is has February 11, the hotel registration has been extended to 2/20/22. Check out the usforum website for the speakers and scheduled events!

The WEP/GPO legislation is undergoing a lot of activity right now with the cosponsors signing onto the legislation. Your legislators need to hear from you whether they have already signed on as a sponsor or not. There are 4 pieces of legislation now, the newest one is H.R. 5834 introduced by Congressman Brady of Texas. This pertains only to the WEP and provides a formula different from H.R. 2337, the Public Servants Protection and Fairness Act of 2021introduced by Representative Neal.

The other two pieces of legislation ask for full repeal of both the WEP/GPO: H.R. 82 the Social Security Fairness Act of 2021 introduced by Rep Rodney Davis with no funding solution offered and H.R. 5723- Social Security 2100: A Sacred Trust introduced 10/26/2021 by Congressmen Larson of Connecticut. It offers a funding solution by increasing the limit on earnings for social security tax withholding to over \$400,000 from the current limit of \$147,800 for 2022.

The best way to keep informed of all the legislation of interest to you is to set up a free account on congress.gov. Click on "legislation" next to the search bar to find the subjects of interest to you or type in the bill number. Then click the send alerts for each piece of legislation you are interested in following. Other legislation I have shared with you in the 117th Congress are:

H.R 2817 Childcare for Working Families Act-House Ed/Labor Committee

H.R. 614 Put School Counselors Where They're Needed Act -House Ed/Labor Committee

S.2730 Comprehensive Mental Health in Schools Pilot Program Act of 2021 Senate HELP Committee

S.1585 Improving Mental Health for Students Act Passed Senate, held in the House

H.R. Abby Honold Act (violence against women trauma-informed investigations)

H.R.721 Mental Health for Students Services Act, passed House, in the Senate HELP committee

H.R. 586 Stand Up Act of 2021 (Suicide Awareness/Prevention Training) Passed House , Senate HELP

H.R.729 Strength in Diversity Act (The purpose of this Act is to support the development, implementation, and evaluation of comprehensive strategies to address the effects of racial isolation or concentrated poverty by increasing diversity, including racial diversity and socioeconomic diversity, in covered schools.) Amended in House Ed/Labor and placed on for whole house consideration

And S.2737 Constitution Education is Valuable in Community Schools Act of 2021Senate HELP

The next legislative updates will be shared at the National Legislative Seminar, March 6-8, 2022.

Elections for the 22-24 Steering Committee and Regional Representatives will be held at the International Conference in New Orleans in July. 
